TRAIN TRIP BENDIGO- ECHUCA -RETURN.

Bendigo 11.07 am / Echuca 12.15 pm Echuca 3.54 pm / Bendigo 5.26 pm

Twenty three of us travelled to Echuca on the rail motor from Bendigo, a bit after 11am arriving to Echuca in time for lunch.

Some caught the train from Castlemaine, Kangaroo Flat and Epsom.

The railway between Bendigo and Echuca has gone through an extensive upgrade, with continuous welded rail, which gives a quicker, smother and quieter ride. Additionally, sleepers have been upgraded to concrete, along with extensive signaling, crossing, bridge and ballast upgrades.





Leaving Bendigo, we experienced a different perspective, whizzing past many suburban backyards to the ever-growing Epsom- Huntly corridor, including passing through the Wellsford Forest - where already, houses are marching towards Bagshot, due to continuing huge housing developments.

So, the new Huntly railway station, which is a bit isolated for now- ultimately will be around about the centre of this growing area. Back in the 1950s, there was an unmanned railway station near the brick bridge at Huntly




The rural plains north of Huntly are flat and now dry, with many grain crops approaching harvest. Goornong has a new station and pedestrian traffic lights adjacent to the station. The amenity of a reinstated station, means people from the surrounding area can connect with the rail network to Bendigo, Melbourne and beyond.



Smith's Chrysler Museum kyneton Australia

A very interesting repository of auto history, especially in respect to local Australian production of Chrysler Valiants and their variants of which were many on display.

Sadly, Australia no longer manufactures cars - *essentially, the numbers did not add up*. Economy of scale was lacking, for what was a miniscule market, in terms of world-wide auto production.

Other factors: - buyer preference shifted away from buying largish sedans, in preference for smaller vehicles and no one can ignore the huge adoption of so-called SUVs of all shapes and sizes, including over-size utes!

The positive outcome of the era was that eventually, Australian engineers, engineered and produced world class vehicles - refer to latter Falcons and Commodores, which were so much more superior to the vehicles previously foisted on the Australian motoring public, which frankly was - very basic American "engineering".

In the meantime, some of the design and engineering expertise survives for now - example, Australian engineering expertise in developing the Ford Ranger and other engineering projects, contracted by overseas manufacturers.

The Smith family has been active in supporting orphans in Timor -Leste, assisting with rebuilding an orphanage destroyed by the Indonesians, as they were withdrawing from the territory. The Smith family continue to support the orphanage with food on a yearly basis, plus entrance donations made to the museum by visitors.




