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
FROM THE EDITOR

"KUMATO" Tomato - Yummo!

On the subject of good food - I discovered these tomatoes at Aldi.

I put them aside for a week or more - This is a tomato with taste and I understand are produced year round in Queensland.

Anyway, I was delighted with the texture, a little sweetness and most of all flavour - no more cardboard! According to the internet, they are available at regular supermarkets - they will probably be more expensive - but not tastless! perfection.com.au



'Kumato' is a trade name given to a patented cultivar of tomato developed in Spain called 'Olmeca'. It is firm, with a color ranging from a green to reddish brown or purple, varying in flavor from almost no flavor to sweeter than typical tomatoes due to a higher fructose content. *Kumato™* tomatoes ripen from the inside out, their color changing naturally from dark brown to a golden green.

The 'Kumato' is a hybrid, and planted seeds will

not necessarily grow plants identical to the parent.

It tastes a little different, succulent, sweet and slightly tart, it's a complex-tasting European cocktail tomato. Kumatoes have a stronger, harder skin than a regular tomato and therefore a longer shelf life.

COOK'S CORNER BEEF TORTILLA STACK

Credit goes to Sharon Rowe for suggesting a recipe section - so here goes!

750g lean beef mince

5 tortilla sheets

½ cup grated tasty cheese

1 cup finely diced onion

1 teaspoon crushed garlic (in jar)

½ cup corn kernels

1 cup small capsicum diced (or tinned)

1 x 425g crushed tomatoes

3 tablespoons tomato paste


1½ cups water

1 teaspoon beef stock powder

1 x 35g pkt taco seasoning (Old El Paso)

Cooking spray

Preheat oven to 180° fan forced.



When cooked drain and place in a bowl, leave to one side.

Add all the remaining ingredients to saucepan except tortilla sheets and cheese.

Bring mixture to boil and simmer 10 mins.

Remove 1 cup of the tomato sauce and leave to one side – this will go on the top.

Add the mince to remaining sauce and bring to boil.

Coat a deep round dish (to fit tortilla wraps) with cooking spray and lay 1 tortilla sheet on base and spread 1½ cups of mince sauce over sheet – repeat 3 times.

Top with last tortilla sheet and cover with reserved tomato sauce. Sprinkle cheese over top. Bake for 30 mins or until cheese has browned. This recipe is from

For me it started back in the late1980's, when Dad purchased a 1965 Chevrolet Impala, which was our first project together. We spent much time together pre and post restoration and once it was completed (famous last words) another project would take place.

At the age of 15 I was lucky enough to find an EH Holden sedan. A father and son project that was to be my first car. Starting out as a 179 red 6, it was my every day car for 2 years. This project and Dad's major influence were the foundation that saw me gain an apprenticeship with the local Mitsubishi dealership where I worked for 9 years.

After 2 years of service with a 6 cylinder the EH was to gain what it has today... a small block Chevrolet V8 and a few cosmetic changes. Hopefully in the next year or so it will see a few Sunday runs, after a very long- winded freshen up.




Chris's Cave - Includes a huge variety of memorabilia: automobiles, videos, music, numerous collectables and copies of historic newspapers, etc.

Ever since my passion for cars began, I've been a collector of anything interesting or different. The man cave was something both Dad and I wanted to do, but unfortunately it wasn't to be. After his passing, I decided to rearrange the shedding and carry out our project anyhow, even though he wasn't there. His mentoring, instructions and example of working with wood, metal and having a good thought process, got me through.

Although it's not as glamorous as some man caves, I've managed to keep the costs low and I love to get out there after a busy week. My collection consists different things such as VHS movies, old oil tins, car memorabilia, key chains, hats, posters and much more.

Some changes show Premier wheel trims and the car has been lowered, which gives it a better appearance. In today's world the HD styling has survived better than the previous model Holdens, with its curved sides and wraparound taillamps. Ford encountered similar problems with their controversial styled AU Falcons with the buying public back in 1998. 'Too modern too soon' is a problem and like the Chrysler Airflow in 1934, car styling needs to evolve slower to maintain popularity with customers.

Chris Beale and Holden HD designer Leo Pruneau - Restored Cars 2019

I had received information regarding a HD Holden sedan, which had been sitting for 30 years, following the owner's death, covered in dust and looking very tired.

I could see great potential. A price was sorted followed by a 12 month basic restoration, which saw it return to the condition when it was first purchased from Wattie Corrie Motors Bendigo.

Our last HD Holden feature was in Restored Cars #128 in 1998, a Premier sedan, so with this in mind, we thought it was time we should have another look at this popular model, this time a Special.

The HD Holden was released in February 1965, selling to April 1966. The motoring magazines gave it a good rap at the time with no mention of the later controversial styling subjects, such as curved side styling and the leading knife-edge front fenders.

New also was a concave rear window with curved side glass, which was a first for all GM cars around the world, although Pontiac had the concave rear window on their 1963 and 1964 Grand Prix models. Finally for Holden the HD series was up-to-date style wise with current GM world models, although the previous EJ-EH models did come close. The Hydra-Matic transmission was replaced with a 2 speed Powerglide unit. Other options were disc brakes fitted to the kingpin type front end on later editions. Engines available were the red 149cid with high and low compression, the 179cid version and the 179 X2 running twin carburettors with an output of 140hp,





Most unusual these days is an original rubber mat used in Specials and lesser models. This car never came with a lot of extras and Chris decided to keep it that way, not going the carpet route. An under dash radio has been added and a rev counter between the main gauges. The car is still fitted with a column shift coupled to a 3 speed manual transmission.

Going through "stuff" as you do, I came across these cards featuring cars and trucks of all descriptions.




The back of the cards feature a tyre. These were Ern's when he was in his early teens. There are 35 cards in Ern's collection. Missing 1 x France.
