## **BEECHEY'S HOT HUDSON**

## Norm Beechey's Hudson.

Stormin' Norman Beechey to turned up in a 1952 Hudson Hornet at a recent hot rod and classic car gathering in central Victoria.

For readers who might be a bit hazy about tin-top racing

action prior to the Moffat/Brock era it's worth noting that Norm Beechey more or less set the stage for Australia's enduring love affair with V8 touring car competition. Beechey's exuberant punting of a V8 Ford Customline in the 1950s began to build his fan base. In 1965, Beechey, along with Bob Jane, went on to introduce Ford Mustangs to Australian motorsport – very emphatically in Beechey's case, using his new 'Pony Car' to win his first Touring Car Championship.

He was very ecumenical, competing in numerous makes during his 16-plus years of competition. Prior to his Mustang adventures (and post-Customline) he had been the Holden tribe's first superhero, initially in his 'Humpy' PK 752 followed by his EH S4 PK 751(cars often competed wearing number plates then and many were driven to and from circuits). He was back with GM when he won his second Touring Car Championship in 1970 with his mighty GTS 350 Monaro. Beechey retired from racing in 1972 to concentrate on his business activities.

In the early-1950s Hudson Hornets were proper US muscle cars given their dominance of early NASCAR racing.



"This actually isn't my first Hornet. I bought my first when I was 19. It was a right-hand-drive car that was brought into Australia from Malaya. I bought it locally in Melbourne from a jockey."

To understand how a Brunswick boy of 19 could be flush enough to stump up the money a Hornet was

worth it helps to know something of Beechey's background as a trader.

Throughout his racing career as he delighted fans with his flamboyant race-winning style, Beechey was running a number of car and truck businesses. However it wasn't widely appreciated that he began trading in cars before he started shaving. He revealed to me that he was only 13 when he bought his first car, a Swift. He quickly moved it on, more than doubling his money in the process. He built on that profitable-trading template throughout his teenage years, enabling him to contribute to the family budget while establishing his bona fides as a successful businessman. Buying that first Hornet at age 19 was a mark of that success. "I bought this one in the USA a few years back after a bit of a search. I like its open pillarless styling and it's a surprisingly lively performer – it's quite light for its size because of its advanced chassis design for the time, with plenty of torque from the big 'Twin H-Power' 308."



## Five-litre flathead

In its day the muscular 160hp from the big twin-carb 308ci (5-litre) flathead six made the Hornet super competitive in NASCAR competition.

The ace up its sleeve was its combination of superior aerodynamics and handling, both due to its "step-down", semi-unitary chassis design that reduced the car's height and weight, while also lowering its centre-of-gravity.

## caranddriver 7/2023 1985 ZiL Russian Limousine

This Russian Federation artifact was rumoured to have been Mikhail Gorbachev's transporter at one time. (EDITED) BY <u>BRENDAN MCALEER</u> PUBLISHED: JUL 21, 2023



- As the official state limousines of the Soviet state, ZiL limousines offered luxuries available to only a select few.
- This one was reportedly part of the fleet used by Mikhail Gorbachev, and was in service with the Russian Federation until 2001.

With all due respect to the likes of the Lada Niva or the GAZ Volga, some Russia-made cars are more equal than others. Today's pick is a battleship-sized limousine from the height of the Cold War, a ZiL 41045 believed to have ferried none other than Mikhail Gorbachev himself.



Just look at the *size* of this thing. The styling is pure Soviet Blocky, all square angles and imposing bulk. You can just imagine it idling at a curb in front of some brutalist concrete structure, waiting patiently to ferry its occupants to a high-level meeting about nuclear proliferation or vassal states or the strategic national vodka reserve.

ZiL stands for *Zavod Imeni Likhachyova*, the name taken from the factory in which these cars were built. Before that, the company was ZIS, the S standing for Stalin. This is a car as deeply Russian as borscht, or accidentally coincidentally falling out of a window after issuing public criticisms of the current ruling party. This example was built in 1985, which saw ZiL make



some minor cosmetic upgrades to its long-running limousines. The mechanicals remained the same as the previous 4104 model: a 300-hp 7.7-liter V-8, a three-speed automatic transmission, and a curb weight of roughly 7000 pounds. Oh, and by the way, that V-8 has redundant ignition and fueling systems and is hardened against EMP strikes.

Inside, this ZiL is as well appointed as a Soviet leader's summer dacha, with mohair seats in back and birchwood veneers. You also get a Radiotehnika stereo and a Vilma cassette player—ideal for blasting out Boney M's *Rasputin*. It's 20 feet of Politburo special treatment. You'd probably also need to get yourself one of those fur hats.



Built in vanishingly small numbers, a ZiL limousine makes for a unique collector car, albeit one with a prodigious thirst for highoctane fuel (95 octane is recommended). You need not approve of the policies of an era which produced a forelites-only car.

The Triumph TR3 pictured was purchased in June 1960 and disposed of in September 1960 after having traveled just over 5000 miles. It was trialed at the time Victoria Police were using many Triumph motor cycles and was used on the Calder Highway Patrol from Melbourne to Bendigo and driven by First Constable Jack Brauman. The car was considered too small and the truck drivers continually complained they could not see it, so it was sold.
